William H. Rosenblatt, MD

Dr. Rosenblatt is the Professor of Anesthesiology and Surgery (Otolaryngology) at Yale University School of Medicine in New Haven, CT. He is the founding member and past president of the Society for Airway Management, and the 2010 winner of the SAM Distinguished Service Award.

He has been practicing anesthesiology for 25 years. The last 10 years almost exclusively head and neck cancer anesthesiology. He has authored more than 30 original articles and has given over 200 live presentations on airway management.

Dr. Rosenblatt is president of AirwayOnDemand, which brings a complete airway workshop to practice groups and state ANA societies around the US. Today's workshop is the 89 AOD workshops since 1997, and the third at AANA.
